A TEMPEST

IN A TEAPOT

Another Attack on Fulton Causes a Temporary Row

Last week Collier's magazine published an article, containing letters that passed between Senators Mitchell and Fulton and State Senator Brownell and others, and the inference is drawn that the appointment of John Hall as United States district attorney was made on condition of his promised immunity from prosecution of Senator Brownell. There is nothing whatever in the published letters that would directly lead to this conclusion, and the whole affair savors greatly of revenge, in which Brownell and others seem to be implicated.

The charge that Fulton sought to protect Brownell is indignantly denied by the United States Senator.

In reply Senator Fulton says: "The charge that I tried to protect Brownell from indictment and to do so promised to support Hall for reappointment on condition that he would not prosecute Brownell, is absolutely and unqualifiedly false. As concerns the Mitchell letter it is not improbable that I did endorse it. It is charged that through my brother in January, 1896, I offered Brownell \$500 for this letter. Aside from this being an infamous lie, its absurdity is apparent, when it is considered that as a matter of fact, Brownell delivered the letter in question and all of my correspondence with him to a Government agent in the Summer of 1905, and in November, 1905, the President furnished me with a copy of this letter."

In referring to two brief letters quoted in the article in Colliers purporting to come from Charles H. Carey and John Hall, urging him to prevent Bristol's confirmation, the Senator said he had had thorough search made through his files and no such letters were found. He declared one of two conclusions was logical, presuming the letters had been written: Either the letters were abstracted from his files or else they were taken from the mails before reaching him. He had no knowledge of having ever seen them. As a matter of fact, the Senator attaches no importance to the letters.
