McDaniel, who claimed he represented the Mutual Reserved Life Insurance company, and who did a great deal of business in this and Lake counties, is charged with dishonest practices in the transaction of his business. The policies were forwarded to Portland and refused, presumably because they were not accompanied by the cash. It is understood that several people have applied for warrants for his arrest.

This office is in receipt of a circular from the United States Land Office, being a copy of the instructions given to special agents, registers and receivers of the land department throughout the United States, in which they are directed to see that all illegal fences are removed from the public domain after April 1. They will not wait for specific complaints, but are to proceed against the offending parties upon information, no matter from what source it comes. The real purpose of the circular is to force Congress to take some action of the bill for the leasing of the public domain. This bill has been before Congress for a long time and has been pigeon-holed for political reasons. President Roosevelt has determined to force the hand of the lawmakers and instructed Secretary Hitchcock to issue the order above referred to. If the bill is not passed at this session, there will be lively times in some sections where the fencing of the public domain has been very prevalent.

Instead of putting on an extra stage, as was at first the intention of the Oregon Stage company, the regular schedule will be changed so that all stages will leave this city for Pokagama at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. Passengers will remain over night at Spencer's and leave there in time to make connection with the 10:55 a. m. train at Pokagama. Thus it will take nearly 20 hours to cover the distance of 36 miles.
