**SUMMONS**

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for Klamath County. California Northeastern Railway Company, a corporation, plaintiff, vs. Leo S. Robinson and the Klamath Water Users Association, a corporation, defendant.

To Leo S. Robinson, one of the above-named defendants.

In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled action, on or before June 13th, 1907. Said date being six weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer, Plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in complaint, namely for judgment for the condemnation and taking of strips of land within the East Half of the Southwest quarter of Section 11, Township 49 South of Range 8 East of Willamette Meridian. A strip sixty (60) feet in width, being thirty (30) feet on each side of center line of a railroad now located and surveyed along and upon the said East Half of the Southwest quarter of said Section 11, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at a point on the North line of the East Half of the Southeast quarter of Section 11, Township 49, South of Range 8 East of Willamette Meridian, at or near a point known as "Engineer's Survey Station G No. 2903-49," thence running south sixteen degrees fifty-three and a half minutes (16° 53 1/2') west through said Section 11, to a point on the south boundary line of said subdivision which is at or near the point known as "Engineer's Station G No. 2875-60"; also for the purpose of proper construction, security, convenience and operation of said road and for side tracks, depots, water stations, cuttings and embankments, will condemn and appropriate two strips of land each forty-five (45) feet wide, lying one on the northwest and the other on the southeast side of the aforementioned right of way for its entire length, and immediately adjacent thereto, in the said East Half of the Southeast quarter of said Section 11, all or said tracts containing nine and five hundred seven-thousandths (9,573) acres, and that the damages for taking and condemning said right of way be assessed. This summons is published by order of Hon. J. B. Griffith, County Judge of Klamath County, made on the 30th day of April, 1907. By said order of the Court, it is directed that this summons be published in the Klamath Republican once a week for six (6) consecutive weeks.
