Dutch Feminine Costumes Are Too Complex For Words.

The women's costume is a trifle too complex for verbal description, as you will find a man under it. feminine belongings usually are, but the white lace cap which covers the friends as they are to strangers! head from eyebrows to nape of neck and from ear to ear, curving out in rounded wings on each side of her cheeks, is always a conspicuous and inevitable portion of a woman's attire. It may possibly be that on Sunday this cap is a trifle whiter or stiffer or daintier than on week days, but the difference is not very apparent.

The ladies assure us there is a vast difference in the quality of the net and a "great observer of little things" can the amount of handiwork employed, but the lens made no special note of that.
