The Reclamation Service wants two hundred men, and will pay \$3 a day for eight hours. Moore Brothers are in need of a hundred and the Light and Water company could use a dozen or more out of the bunch if they were dissatisfied with the offer of the other two. Throughout the county the farmer is looking for men, while but a few miles to the south is to be heard the cry of the railroad contractors for more men. If there are one thousand men any where on the coast who are looking for work in a coming country; one where they can get good wages and a chance to get hold of something for the future; then the place for them to come is to Klamath, the land of opportunity.

### Chamber of Commerce

The regular meeting of the Chamber of Commerce was held Tuesday evening, when the report of the committee having in charge the exhibit at the Irrigation Congress, made its report. A vote of thanks was tendered the committee for the splendid work it did.
