Under this plan, a settler on an unfinished project may undertake work under such a contract as described, earn enough during the Winter to meet his payments that are likely to fall due in the Spring, and thereby reserve to himself whatever cash he may have otherwise intended to pay over to the Government for his water. Others may earn perhaps half the amount of the charges against them. But whatever the measure, the Reclamation Service believes this plan of co-operation will tend materially to lighten the burden on the settlers and render it easier for them to meet their payments.
