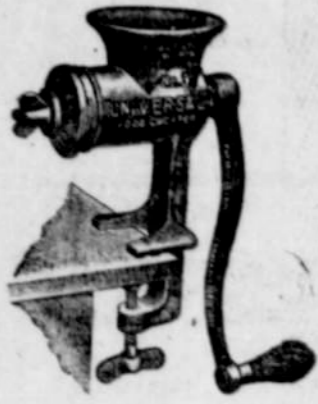

Will G. Steel, of Portland, arrived in the city on Monday for a short stay on business connected with the Crater Lake Company.

The Council Monday evening appointed the Finance committee to interview the Reclamation officials in regard to the city acquiring the old Askeny canal, which runs from the Upper Lake through the city, for purposes of irrigation and to supply running water on the principal streets. The committee is composed of Councilmen Sanderson, Crisler and Obenchain.

Otto Heidrich, Wm. Dulaney and James Crane, who were indicted for violation of the Local Option law, appeared before Judge Noland Monday afternoon and pleaded guilty to the charge. As the offense was committed some time ago and two of the men have since engaged in legitimate business and Mr. Crane is about to leave the city, Judge Noland imposed a fine of \$150 on Mr. Heidrich and the indictment against Mr. Dulaney was dismissed. Imposing of a fine on Mr. Crane was suspended.

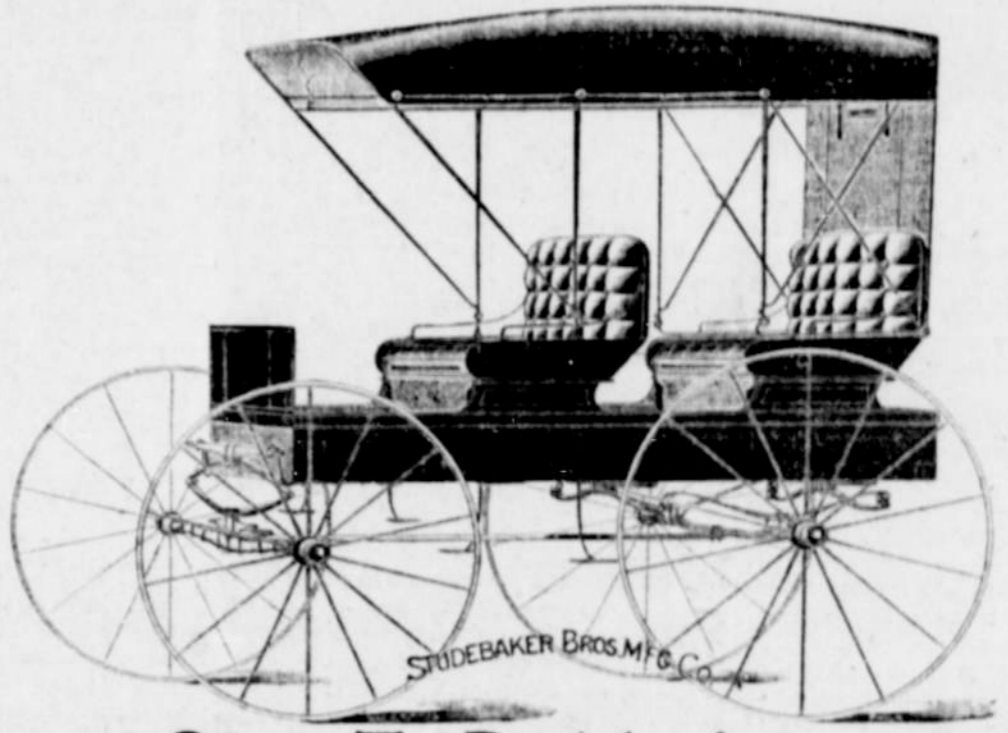
