GAME LAW ALL RIGHT.

Senator Merryman, who returned Monday evening from San Francisco, states that there evidently is a mistake in the reported provisions of the game law relative to duck shooting in Klamath County. The Senate committee reported unfavorably on an amendment to reduce the limit of the open season in this county, but he had the amendment inserted in the bill in the House and it was passed by that body. It was returned to the Senate with the amendment just before the end of the session, and was concurred in by that body. The duck law provides for an open season in Klamath County from September 1 to February 15.

Dr. Merryman thinks that the law must have been printed from the original bill and not as it was finally amended. He states, however, that when he goes to Salem for the special session he will go over the bill and see that it is correct. The game law will probably have to be reenacted as other mistakes have been found in some of the provisions.

NO INCREASE IN FREIGHT RATES FROM MT. HEBRON.

Lewis Gerber, the stockman, states that the raise in the freight rates on stock shipments to the California markets will not affect shipments from Mt. Hebron as the rate from that point will remain the same. The rate from this point has heretofore been \$25 a car higher than from points on the main line. The increase from Montague and Gazelle will bring the rate to within \$19 of that from Mt. Hebron and will about equalize the charges for shipments to Portland and San Francisco.
