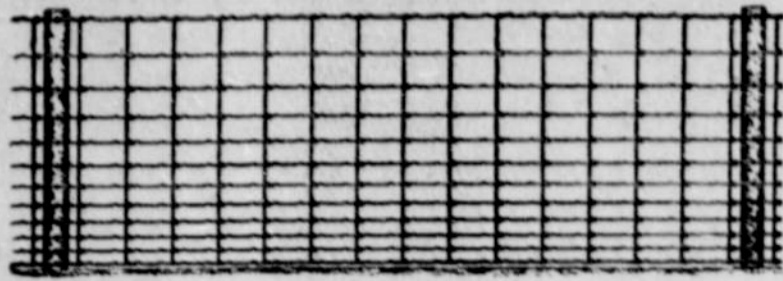

### MAY GO TO SHASTA JULY 4TH.

It is quite probable that there will be an excursion on the Fourth to Shasta Springs. Some of the citizens have taken the matter up with the Southern Pacific company and have been practically promised a special train on that day if 150 excursionists are secured. Shasta is one of the prettiest spots in California, and the possibility of spending eight or ten hours there of the Fourth of July strongly appeals to many of the people here, and the opinion is expressed that fully 500 people would make the trip if a special rate is secured.
