J. E. Whitlatch, Geo. Fullerton, D. M. Hahn, J. E. Moore and Mrs. Bebee are all in the city from Merrill.

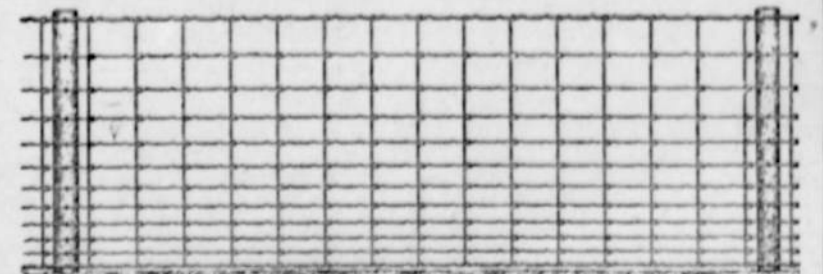
O. N. and G. H. Johnston were in from Summer Lake this week to buy their winter supplies.
