

COUNTY COURT

Be it remembered that at a regular term of the Honorable County Court of Klamath County, Oregon, begun and held at the Court House in Klamath Falls, in said County, on Wednesday, January 5, 1910, at 10 o'clock a. m., and continuing from day to day throughout the term, when were present: Hon. J. B. Griffith, Judge; S. T. Summers, Commissioner; C. R. DeLap, Clerk; W. B. Barnes, Sheriff; when the following proceedings were had:

In the matter of the tax levy for 1909. It appearing to the Court from the assessment of Klamath County for the year 1909 that the total valuation of taxable property is, after all lawful exemptions, and as equalized by the Board of Equalization, \$11,315,440.

That to raise said amounts the tax levies are hereby made as follows: For state purposes, 2 mills on the dollar.

For general purposes, 3.5 mills on the dollar.

For school purposes, 2.5 mills on the dollar.

For road purposes, 2 mills on the dollar.

For new court, 3 mills on the dollar.

For high school, .97 mills on the dollar.

For library, .03 mills on the dollar.

In the matter of the tax levy for school districts Nos. 1, 5, 4, 28 and 11, for the payment of interest on their outstanding bonds:

It appearing from the certificate of Claude H. Daggett, county treasurer, that districts 1, 5, 4, 28 and 11, have neglected to levy a tax for the purpose of paying interest on outstanding school bonds issued by said districts, and it further appearing from said certificate that the total amounts to be raised by each district are as follows:

District No. 1 \$2,700.00; No. 5 90.00; No. 4 60.00; No. 28 285.00; No. 11 95.00.

And to raise said amounts, it will be necessary to make the following levies:

District No. 1, 1.5 mills on the dollar.

It appearing to the Court from the estimates made by J. G. Swan, county school superintendent, that school districts Nos. 10, 22 and 30 will require levies as follows to raise the required amount of funds to make up their deficiencies, in compliance with law, viz:

District No. 30, 2 mills on the dollar.
