States Land Office, Washington, D. C., April 20, 1910:

"In case of sale by a private owner f part of the irrigable land covered y a subsisting water right applicaon, the vendor, in order to have his vater right charges adjusted to the duced acreage retained by him, will e required to present to you the fo!wing evidences:

"First. Certificate of the proper fficer having charge of the county ecords, showing record of a subscripion for stock in the local water users' sociation covering the land in queson, and that the land has been duly onveyed by the subscriber at a time ubsequent to the recording of the tock subscription.

Second. The certificate of the local rater users' association, under cororate seal, to the effect that proof as been presented to the association f the transfer of the land to the peron named and that appropriate of the shares of stock appurtenant to aid land.

As an alternative, or in case no asociation has been organized on the roject, the vendor should so arrange hat his vendee shall promptly make water right application for the irgable land within the tract conveyed o him and upon presentation and acoptance of such application approriate notation of such transfer, with reference to the new water right aplication, will be made on the original or prior water right application.
