VAST QUANTITY OF TIMBER TO BE SOLD

Condition Is That the Humboldt and Kastern Railroad Be Completed

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 15 .-

The forest service announced today that it will sell a billion feet of timber in the Trinity reserve on the condition that the Humboldt and Eastern railroad is completed and operated to Wildwood within five years. The promoters represented that this will insure the success of the road.

The government requires the removal of the timber within ten years. It sets a minimum price of \$1.50 per 1,000 feet for the first five years and \$2 for the second five years. It is to traffic. be auctioned. Reselling for speculation is prohibited.

The department has announced that its intention is to aid the development of Northwestern California as much as possible.




