SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 16 .- A reapportionment of the assembly and senatorial districts is to be the program of the next legislature. The constitution provides that the legislature shall re-apportion the state following the announcement of the federal census, which will be used as a basis for the re-apportionment. The ratio of the growth of Southern California is so much greater than the northern part of the state that it is expected the increase of representatives from the south will be at the expense of the northern portion of the state. The constitution says there are to be only forty senatorial and cighty assembly districts. Therefore the legislators necessarily will be compelled to increase the average of population in each district throughout the state. The districts showing the lesser increase will suffer over those showing the greater increase in population.
