ASKS DEPARTMENT FOR AN INSPECTOR

Paper Will Be Forwarded to Post-office Department at Washington in a Day or So

A petition asking the first assistant postmaster general at Washington, D. C., to send an inspector here to look over the town, condition of streets, lights, etc., and postoffice receipts, etc., has been circulated by Postmaster Emmitt and freely signed by the residents of Klamath Falls. This will be sent to Washington tomorrow in all probabilities.

The circulation of this petition is one of the steps necessary in the securing of the much-wanted free mail delivery here, and it follows the resolutions passed by the city council and sent to the postoffice department. All realize the fact that Klamath Falls has attained sufficient size to warrant establishment of a free delivery system here, and as the postoffice receipts for the fiscal year just completed are more than the amount required, a determined effort is being made to secure the service.

ASSOCIATION FEELS PLEASSED

THINKS MUCH ROAD IMPROVEMENT ACCOMPLISHED

State Good Roads Association Does Not Intend to Give Up Fight for Better Highways

PORTLAND, Feb. 11.—Whether or not the state legislature provides Oregon with a plan for systematic highway construction the Oregon Good Roads association believes that during the last year more has been actually accomplished toward permanent making of good roads than during any other period in the state's history. This is because of the widespread conviction which it has been possible to obtain that Oregon's first and greatest development is good roads construction.

One of the most potent factors for the dissemination of educational matter leading up to the general conviction of good roads need has been the out-state papers (members of the association). Discussions of the need of better built highways and of the plan for securing them have, in the papers referred to, been full and free and frank and effective.

The Oregon Good Roads association does not intend to give up the fight for highway construction whether the good roads laws as adopted by the legislature are satisfactory or not. The leaders of the organization believe that with the help of the state press and the progressive citizenship unofficial promotion of the good roads will be effective and desirable either in conjunction with the enforcement of such laws as may be passed, or if the laws are not passed the unofficial plan it is believed will be even more effective than legislation.

Order Vacating Road

In the matter of the application of the vacation of the Klamath and Crook County road, inside of the town plat of Crescent, Oregon:

And, now, to-wit: On this the 20th day of January, 1911, the court being in session, the matter of the application of the vacation of said road comes on regularly for hearing, the petitioners appearing by E. L. Elliott, their Attorney, and it appearing to the court by proper affidavits and the petition on file that the proper signatures have been procured, and that Notice, as required by law, has been posted and filed, and the court having jurisdiction thereof and the facts and circumstances being presented to the court, and it further appearing to the court from the records and proceedings to this court, that, to-wit:

On the 26th day of April, 1910, the County Court of the State of Oregon, in and for Klamath County, did accept and approve a certain plat of the town of Crescent, and it further appearing from said plat of the town on file in the office of the clerk of this court that in said plat there is a dedication of certain streets and alleys for public use, and highways, and it further appearing to this court that the Klamath and Crook County road conflicts with said streets, alleys, highways, and avenues in the said town of Crescent, as shown by said plat.

It is therefore, hereby ordered, adjudged, and decreed by the court that the said Klamath and Crook County road be and the same is hereby vacated as a public highway, and the same is hereby ordered closed and abandoned for further use as a public highway.

This matter came on this day for a hearing and it appearing to the court upon the application of Alvin McPherson and from the statement of W. B. Barnes, Sheriff and Tax Collector, that the said Alvin McPherson paid to Klamath County, taxes during the years 1906-1907-1908-1909-1910 amounting in all to \$90.47, including interest on the following described lands, viz:

The NW 1/4 Sec. 30, Tp. 38 S. R. 6 E. W. M. That at some time prior to the year 1906, the said Alvin W. McPherson claimed the above described tract of land by right of homestead entry. That subsequently the United States contested entryman's claim, to said land and by virtue of said contest the claim of Alvin W. McPherson was cancelled by the Government of the United States.

Therefore the said petitioner made application to the court for a return of the amount of the Taxes paid said Klamath County.

It is therefore hereby ordered that the clerk draw a warrant on the general fund of the county in favor of Alvin W. McPherson for \$90.47, refund of taxes.

In the matter of the purchase of metal culverts, plows, scrapers, etc. for county roads.

This matter came on to be heard on this day, and it appearing to the court that it is necessary that the county purchase road culverts, plows, scrapers, etc., for county roads, and that it will be for the best interests of the public to purchase metal culverts amounting to \$3324.00, and plows and scrapers and other tools amounting to \$1156.00.

It is therefore hereby ordered that said road supplies be purchased from Beal & Company of Portland, Oregon, and that same be paid for out of the General Fund of the County upon the delivery of said goods, F. O. B. Portland, Oregon.
