

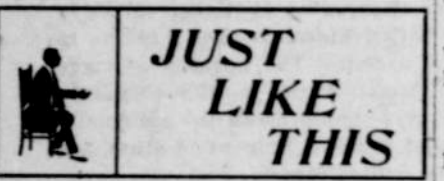
FORT KLAMATH NOW HAS BANK

LIVE TOWN NEAR THE UPPER
LAKE TAKES ANOTHER GREAT
STRIDE TOWARD BECOMING A
CITY IN REAL EARNEST

FORT KLAMATH, July 24.—The filing of the application for the Bank of Fort Klamath was completed Saturday, following the signing up of the agreement made between several parties who are stockholders in the bank. Drew P. Osborne, the man who for twenty years has handled the millions of Congressman Kent of California is the man who is putting in the bank. A short time since Mr. Osborne sold out his own interest in the Golconda Cattle company at Elko, Nev., for \$250,000, and was looking for a new field of investment when he met an old Nevada friend in the person of M. W. A. Ferguson, known as "Billy Scott" or plain Malcolm Ferguson, who had a contract from L. C. Sisemore and other Fort Klamath people to get a live one to start a bank for them, and today's organization is the result. The bank will have a local board of directors, of which L. C. Sisemore will be president, and Dan Ryan, Jim Pelton, W. E. Nicholson, Lee Denton, Jim Dixon, Ben Looney and others will be on the board of directors. Also Malcolm Ferguson himself, who took \$1,000 interest in the institution.

Mr. Osborne, of course, will not devote all his time to the bank, as he will be looking for investments in the land now thrown open for sale on the reservation. Mr. Ferguson will attend to the inspection of land, and will live at the north end of the lake.

Wickes was convicted of having obtained \$15 on a check drawn on a bank in which he had no money.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 20.—After investigating the death of Anita C. Laplacha, a 16-year-old girl, believed to have come here from either Fresno

or Bakersfield, the police have taken into custody Mrs. Salzarie Mingilino, a midwife, and Dr. M. S. Guberson. The girl died at the home of Mrs. Mingilino while undergoing an operation.

LOS ANGELES, July 24.—Returning to a burning structure in order to save an Angora cat and her three kittens, Louise B. Frederic of New York, an artist, was killed last night in a fire in Garavanza suburb. He was visiting at the home of Jude Maultin, when the pet cat, scratching the bed clothes, awakened Mrs. Maultin, who gave the alarm.

Eleven persons fled from the house, and Frederic, in his night clothes, rushed back to get the pets. The roof fell as he entered.
