WILL INCREASE MILL CAPACITY. ALGOMA MILL WILL CUT 125,000 FEET DAILY—COMMENCE SAWING TIMBERS FOR SAME SATURDAY. R. H. Hovey is down from the Algoma Lumber company's headquarters on the Upper Lake. He says that George C. Clark, the contractor, is busy driving the piles for the foundation for the new saw mill. The company has decided to enlarge the mill over the plans first made, and more power is to be added, so that the mill will have a daily capacity of 125,000 feet for a ten-hour shift. The mill will be equipped with both band and gang saws. The old Campbell mill, which was purchased by the Algoma company, will be started in operation Saturday, and will cut the timbers for the new mill and for other buildings and residences. As soon as this is done the old mill will be torn down. Work on the residences has not commenced as yet, as there is considerable snow still on the ground, but as soon as this goes off the new mill town will become a busy place.
