ILLINOIS STATESMAN ADDRESSES GREAT CROWD IN SENATE

Vigorously Attacks Taft and Roosevelt Newspapers Who, He Declares, Are in a Conspiracy to Destroy Him-Vote Will Probably Be Taken Late This Afternoon-Heat Is Great and Galleries Packed

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 12 .in the senate today, with galleries crowded to capacity and in a stifling heat. Senator Lorimer made his last rica to retain his seat in the United States senate.

He bitterly denounced both the Roosevelt and Taft newspapers as being in a conspiracy to destroy him.

A vote is expected this afternoon. Lorimer said that he didn't take the witness stand during the first investigation because he believed that it was "beneath the dignity of a United States senator to take notice of insinuations." He declared that he believed the senate violated the fundamental law of this country by appointing another committee investigation.'
