

MAN ROLLS INTO BOILING WATER

JOHN HOLLENBECK MEETS WITH SERIOUS ACCIDENT

Tired From Constant Service Guarding Sheep, Herder Lays Down to Rest, But is Soon Awakened When His Body is Immersed in Hot Fluid. He is Rushed to Hospital, Where Injuries are Cared For.

John Hollenbeck, a sheep herder, fell into the boiling water at the hot spring in Hot Springs addition in this city last Friday afternoon, and his right side was cooked almost to a turn. Several people who were in the vicinity were attracted by the cries of the injured man, and rushed to his assistance. He was taken to Blackburn hospital, where Dr. Wright gave him medical attention.

Hollenbeck was employed by Dave Edler, and was in charge of a band of sheep grazing on the outskirts of the city awaiting shipment. He had been on constant duty for some time, and had missed a great deal of sleep.

Friday morning the man went to the hot springs to rest. He laid down on a plank across the boiling hot water. It was warm, and he soon fell asleep. Soon after he rolled off the plank in his sleep and fell into the boiling water.

It was stated at the hospital this afternoon that while Hollenbeck was painfully burned, his injuries would not result fatally.
