

## OTTOMAN CAPITAL CANNOT HOLD OUT FOR MANY DAYS

### HIGH MILITARY OFFICERS MAKE A DECISION

Plan to Prevent Occupation of Constantinople by Bulgarian Soldiers is Now Under Way—Germany Tries to Prevent Austria From Mixing in the Trouble—The Great Nations are Arming

LONDON, Nov. 13.—According to a dispatch from Constantinople, a council of the highest army officers has decided that the city cannot hold out. The Porte is trying to arrange terms of surrender which will not involve the actual occupation of the city by the Bulgarian army.

## SOCIALISTS GET ENCOURAGEMENT

The party leaders, moreover maintain that their total would have been much larger but for the bull moose movement, which they declare attracted many votes from the ranks of socialist sympathizers.

## BREWERY ADMITS CRIMINAL CHARGE

### CELEBRATED CASE IS FINALLY CONCLUDED IN ROSEBURG—NO MORE BEER WILL BE SOLD IN THAT PLACE

ROSEBURG, Nov. 13.—The celebrated case of the state against the Roseburg brewery ended in the circuit court here this morning, when the original plea of not guilty was withdrawn and guilty substituted. The five directors and the manager were fined \$250 each, and the corporation \$500. Their attorney, Dexter Rice, notified the court that to preclude in future the question of the intoxicating quality of the brewery's beer no more of its product would be sold in Roseburg. Last September the trial of the case resulted in no verdict, the jury standing 6 to 6.
