

WOMEN ARE GETTING MUCH AID

AMENDMENT PASSES SENATE BY VOTE OF 40 TO 1

Delegation of Women Sea Chancellors Who Says He Is in Favor of Giving Them What They Ask—If Measure Falls in House of Commons Women Say They Will Cut Up Something Terrible

LONDON, Jan. 23.—Lloyd George today received twenty suffragettes elected from all of England. The deputation included actresses, domestic servants, fish peddlers and boot workers.

Mrs. Norton, a Yorkshire weaver, said:

"If votes for women are not granted women at this season of parliament I warn you that past performances militant will look like pin-pricks compared to what we will do in the future."

The chancellor replied:

"I am personally in favor of suffrage, and pledge the government's support to any measure acceptable to the house of commons."

ALBANY, N. Y., Jan. 23.—The state senate today passed the women's suffrage amendment to the state constitution by a vote of 40 to 1.

The measure contains a provision that those who become citizens through marriage must be residents in the United States five years before they may vote.

NEW YORK STRIKE WILL BE SUBJECT OF PROBE

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 23.—Congressman Berger expects information tonight which may force a congressional inquiry of the garment workers' strike.

"This may develop into as remarkable an exposure of industrial conditions as the Lawrence strike, if the data sent for is what it has been represented," said Mr. Berger, "and I will ask the house for an investigation."

The indications are that evidence is ready to show that factories "speed up" the labor of women and girls in order to compete with the sweat shops.

U. S. MINISTER SENDS REFUGE TO CUBANS

HAVANA, Jan. 23.—The United States minister here has sent a note to the state department couched in strong, unequivocal language in which it is demanded that Cuba immediately ratify the Guantanamo naval station treaty.

The minister also protested against the alleged revolutionary action of many government officials, including the Cuban vice president and speaker of the house.

The action of the United States minister has created a great sensation here, and is being made the subject of much comment.

CORVALLIS, Jan. 23.—In order to be able to furnish the farmers of Oregon with more eggs for hatching and cockerels for breeding from heavy laying strains, and thus make the state an exporter rather than an importer of poultry produce, the Oregon Experiment Station will ask the present legislature for an appropriation for the purchase of some fifty acres for a breeding farm.

Since the establishment of the poultry department of the station at the Oregon Agricultural College five years ago, the value of poultry and eggs produced has increased between three and four million dollars, and this is bound to increase further with the activity of the station experts.

"Production is increasing rapidly, but where will the producer come in if, with increased production he sees his profits diminish?" asks Professor James Dryden, poultry husbandman of the station. "We are rapidly reaching a point where the efficiency of egg laying capacity of the hen must be increased if poultry keeping is to be profitable."

"With more productive fowls the farmer will make more profit, even though the consumer pays more for the eggs. By proper selection of breeding stock as much as in a hundred under the old method of breeding, or lack of breeding."

BAT MARRIES; TOWN CELEBRATES

CHICAGO, Jan. 23.—"Battling" Nelson, former lightweight champion of the world, was married this afternoon to Miss Fay King, a cartoonist of Denver, but formerly of Portland, Oregon.

Moving picture machines were present during the ceremony, and practically the entire town of Hegewich, where the ceremony occurred, attended. A half holiday was declared for the occasion.

PORTLAND, Jan. 23.—Game Warden Finley has a plan for game protection that he hopes will solve the matter of damage done by certain classes of protected birds or animals.

He proposes a blanket measure, giving the fish and game commission absolute power to declare an open season on protected birds or animals at any time and in any locality, when it is found that such birds or animals are doing damage.

Legislation providing for protection to farmers from beavers, pheasants and other game is generally demanded, and Warden Finley hopes to see his plan adopted as a means of protecting the game generally, and still preventing the destruction of property in a few sections.
