

TURKS DECLINE TO MEET DEMANDS

Baron Danef, speaking for the Allies, states that demands will not be repeated by Balkan countries after the first shot is fired, but that they will help themselves from that time.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Jan. 30.—War between Turkey and the Balkan allies will be resumed at the expiration of four days, according to a formal notice given in the ports by the allies this afternoon.

The foreign minister notified the Balkan representatives that he would terminate the armistice at 7 o'clock, but would not start fighting until four days had elapsed.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Jan. 30.—Turkey's reply to the powers was handed to the European ambassadors today. The Turks propose to give the Balkan allies half of Adrianople, retaining the Holy City section, where the Moslem shrines are located.

Turkey declines to surrender the Aegean Islands. In the note the Moslem empire proposes that the status and government of the islands be left to the powers.

It is also suggested that the distribution of the remainder of European Turkey be left to the powers.

"Fight!" Says Danef

LONDON, Jan. 30.—"Peace negotiations cannot be resumed until Turkey agrees to cede the whole of Adrianople, as a basis for the bargaining that the new frontier of Turkey be a line running from the Black Sea to Rodosto," declared Baron Danef today, after the Turkish note had been read.

"The present demands of the allies will not be renewed after the first shot is fired," he continued. "If war is resumed the demands will be still greater."

Revolutionists Active

LONDON, Jan. 30.—Dispatches received today from Constantinople confirm the reports of revolution among Turkish troops at Chatalja.

Many officers and men were killed, and so far 200 have been wounded.

Mrs. William Fordney, wife of the Lorella postmaster, is recovering slowly from an unusually serious operation which was performed at Bonanza recently by Dr. Wright of Klamath Falls.

The Lorella school, which was to have been opened for its second term on January 20th, has been postponed one week, owing to the inclemency of the weather.

Mrs. David Campbell, who has been on the sick list for the last few days, is improving.
