KLAMATH DEGREE TEAMS ARE COMPLEMENTED ON WORK

MEDFORD, May 22.—Over 1,000 Odd Fellows were in the grand parade here, while the streets were packed for 15 blocks with spectators. Nearly 3,000 delegates from all over the state have been present in attendance at the grand lodge and grand assembly.

NEW LAWS WILL HIT SOCIAL EVIL

HEREAFTER, HOUSES OF IL-FAME ARE DECLARED NUISANCES, AND SUIT IN EQUITY CAN BE STARTED

One of the measures to become effective June 3 is the law providing for the abolishment of red light districts, which takes up the eradication of the social evil in an entirely new manner. Instead of attempting to establish the fact that such an institution exists at a jury trial, as is the case at present, under the law, the matter will be taken up as an equity proceeding.

The measure follows Section 1. Whoever shall erect, establish, continue, maintain, use, own or lease any building, erection or place used for the purpose of lewdness, assignation or prostitution, or any other immoral act, is guilty of maintaining a nuisance, and the building, erection or place, or the ground itself, in or upon which, or in any part of which such lewdness, assignation or prostitution is conducted, permitted or carried on, continued or exists, and the furniture, fixtures, musical instruments and contents, are also declared a nuisance, and shall be enjoined and abated as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2. Whenever a nuisance is kept, maintained or exists as defined in this act, the district attorney shall, or any taxpayer of the county may, maintain a suit in equity in the name of the state of Oregon to perpetually enjoin such nuisance, the person or persons conducting or maintaining same, and the owner, lessee or agent of the building or ground upon which such nuisance exists.

Sec. 3. The suit, when brought under the provisions of this act, shall be promptly tried, and in such suit common fame shall be competent evidence in support of the complaint.

Sec. 5. If the existence of the nuisance be established in a suit, as provided in this act, an order of abatement shall be entered as a part of the judgment in the case, which order shall direct the removal from the building or place of all fixtures, furniture, musical instruments or movable property used in conducting said nuisance, and shall direct the sale thereof in the manner provided for the sale of chattels under execution, and the effectual closing of the building or place against its use for any purpose, and so keeping it closed for a period of one year, unless sooner released.
