FOURTH TRIAL

OF HYDE IS ON

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Jan. 5.—The fourth annual trial of Dr. B. Clark Hyde for the murder of Millionaire Thomas H. Swope of Independence, was scheduled to begin here today before Judge E. E. Porterfield, in the criminal court. This trial promised to differ from the others in that United States Senator A. Reed is not assisting in the prosecution. Reed officiated three times.

Hyde, a prominent physician who married the niece of Swope, was indicted for killing the eccentric millionaire, his cousin and nephew, with cyanide of potassium, and with poisoning the whole Swope family, their servants and friends visiting in the house, with typhus germs injected in their food, milk and drinking water. In the first trial Hyde was convicted.

The Missouri supreme court reversed and remanded the case, affirming more than fifty errors alleged by the defense, and scoring the prosecution and presiding judge.

The next trial a juror went insane and climbed out the transom. A mistrial was declared. On the third trial the jury disagreed, and another trial was ordered.
