### GETS MORE GOOD BIRD LIFE FILM

"During the last couple of days we have secured another thousand feet of bird life film," said Managing Director E. A. Salisbury of the Educational Film company, this morning, after his return from work in the Lower Klamath Lake preserve.

"One of the pictures we secured shows the hatching out of the blue heron from the time the little fellow begins to stir in his shell until he fully emerges from it. Mr. Hutt secured in this one of the best nature pictures that has ever been secured."

The members of the party and Game Warden J. J. Furber will go to the Clear Lake preserve tomorrow to take pictures of the pelicans, cormorants and other birds nesting there, after which they will resume their work on Lower Klamath Lake.

### H. BANTA BOUND TO GRAND JURY

Harry Banta, the Pine Flat rancher held on a sodomy charge, preferred by his wife, has been bound over to the grand jury. His bond was placed at \$1,500.

Mrs. Banta, a little woman with four children, all under 5 years, testified as to the unnatural crime of her husband. She stated that the oldest child awoke when he heard her cries, and thinking his mother was being killed, it cried until Banta struck it. Banta waived the hearing.

With her four little children, Mrs. Banta is practically destitute.

### WILLIS GIVEN A SECOND VERDICT

For the second time a Lake county jury in the circuit court has awarded the Willis Furniture company a judgment against the Horticultural Fire Relief Association. This time, the jury was out fifteen minutes.

This action is the result of a fire which destroyed the Lakeview store of the company. Following it the insurance concern accused Willis Sr. of perjury, and he was tried and acquitted.

The furniture concern then brought suit for the insurance, and were awarded the verdict. An appeal was taken to the supreme court, which remanded the case for retrial, which was just held.

### BULLMOOSE TALK IS KEPT SECRET

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 27.—What was discussed at the meeting of Colonel Roosevelt and other progressive leaders last night has not been fully revealed, although some of the progressive admit that the questions of the progressive presidential candidate nor the amalgamation of the party with the old line republicans was not among the topics of conversation.

It is said that Roosevelt approved the efforts of the progressive leaders during his absence, and complimented the legislative program.

Representative Kelly of Pennsylvania admitted that Senator Clapp made an exhaustive report to the bull moose leader, and it is also said that he referred to himself and Senator Poindexter as being the only progressives in the senate.

Murdock also made a detailed report to Roosevelt.

### COLONEL AND MRS. ROOSEVELT

Mrs. Roosevelt took charge of the former president of the United States when he reached quarantine in New York harbor on the steamship Alden, which had brought him from Paris. The reports which had come by wire that he was in bad health, having been stricken by fever in Brazil, had, of course, worried her, and she went out to quarantine with a tug to meet him. There was something of a demonstration from other friends, but it was no such homecoming as on his trip from Africa. The Colonel was hardly in a condition to stand the welcome he was given then.

Roosevelt weighed about sixty pounds less than he did formerly, but the same old spirit was there. He snapped his jaws just as he had done when in the best of health, and he had the same old smile.

The tug which carried him did not take him to the shores of New York city, but headed out to his home at Oyster Bay, some sixty miles away.

Every craft in the lower New York harbor that boasted a whistle blew three long blasts of greeting as the Alden passed. When the vessel entered quarantine the din the waiting tugs emitted was answered by the Alden and by Colonel Roosevelt himself, who stood at the ship's rail flourishing a big Panama hat.

Standing by the starboard rail of the Alden, the progressive leader showed the effects of the illness which nearly cost him his life. His face, beneath a dark coat of tan, painted by a tropical sun, was thin and drawn; his neck was lean and sinewy, while his back tapered from his shoulders to a waist remarkably thin for the Colonel. Before the ship reached quarantine he experienced two chills, proving that the fever had not been eradicated from his system.

### WAR VETS SEND FOR A CHARTER

With a list of fifteen applicants for membership, a request for a charter for William McKinley Camp, United Spanish War Veterans, was at Monday night's meeting drafted and sent to the headquarters of the organization.

When the charter returns it is expected that at least fifteen more veterans will be mustered into the organization as charter members. The application of the fifteen was sent in order to hasten the work of forming the camp.

The first public appearance of the camp will be in the Memorial Day exercises Saturday.

### ELKS TO HAVE CONCESSIONS

Upon motion of Councilman Rogers the council on Monday night granted the Elks' Rodeo Amusement Association exclusive concession privileges during the Rodeo, July 3, 4 and 5.
