# Seaside police to honor fallen officers

The Seaside Police Department will be recognizing National Police Week by wearing special memorial badges on May 15 in recognition of the annual National Peace Officers Memorial Day.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. Thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, D.C., to participate in a number of planned events that honor those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

A total of 1,466 law enforcement officers died in the line of duty during the past 10

years, an average of one death every 60 hours or 146 per year. 117 law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty in 2014, while there have already been 40 law enforcement officers killed in 2015 while on duty as of May 7. One of these officers was an Oregon deputy with the Coos County Sheriff's Office, Deputy Gill Datan, who died on April 20 in an ATV accident.

The Seaside Police Department invites citizens to learn more about the heroes of American law enforcement and join us in respecting, honoring and remembering them.

## Safety fair coming this weekend

Several local organizations and agencies are working together to put on the Seaside Family Safety Fair on May 16. The event will take place from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Seaside Fire Department, 150 S. Lincoln. The fair will feature a bike rodeo, so children are encouraged to bring their bikes. The short obstacle course/cone pattern is designed to help children learn to maneuver their bikes through stop signs and crosswalks and learn basic rules of the road, Seaside Police Chief Dave Ham said. Children also can get an inspection of their bicycle and help tightening chains, if needed.

The event also will provide education on fire safety, pedestrian safety, poison safety, ambulance safety and water safety and include clinics on child

identification and carseats. As children go through informational stations at the fair, they get a stamp on a card. When the card is full, it goes into a drawing for one of two bicycles, one for a girl and one for a boy, Ham said. Money for the bikes and other safety equipment and prizes, such as bells, horns, locks, spoke decorations and other fun stuff, was donated by the Seaside Rotary Club, the Kiwanis Club of Seaside, Providence Seaside Hospital and the Seaside Volunteer Fire Department.


