into a fluffy loaf of bread. He incorporated practical application of some the students' math skills, like working with fractions and measurements.

Sandel then showed students how to manipulate and shape the dough to create a variety of baked goods, from braided loaves of bread to cinnamon rolls and pizza crust. The demonstrator did everything by hand, explaining to students, "artisan bread, which is very, very cool, is made by using your hands, not a machine.'

To finish the presentation, he showed the students how tossing a pizza can replace a rolling pin, as centrifugal force pulls the dough to the outside, creating a wide, thin surface.

"We try to make it as exciting as possible," Sandel said of the demonstration.

Sandel, who previously worked for the Columbia River Maritime Museum, still lives in Astoria, but he travels throughout the 'It's just about sharing; that's what we're looking for'

northwest states, giving demonstrations at schools along with three other national King Arthur Flour program instructors. Because the flour company donates the ingredients and the instructor's time, the program is in high demand, he said.

He is able to return to a given school only every so often. The last time he was in Seaside was two years ago.

Fourth-grade teacher Dan VanNortwick hopes to bring back the program every year so each student passing through Seaside Heights can participate either as a fourth- or fifth-grader. He appreciates that the program lets the students apply practical science and math in an interactive way.

Most importantly, Van-Nortwick said, "it helps the kids to give back to the community.

On Oct. 5, representatives from Manna House Food Pantry — a Clatsop Community Action Regional Food Bank site ran out of Lighthouse Christian Church in Warrenton stopped by the school to collect more than 70 loaves of bread prepared by the students.

Sandel said the program

is designed to encourage the students to be good stewards of their community by putting the extra loaves to use. During the program's life span, various school have donated the bread to an approved food pantry or nonprofit organization – one that accepts homemade foods — or used it for a community dinner at the school. In 2013, Seaside Heights donated the bread to Helping Hands Reentry Outreach Centers.

"It's just about sharing; that's what we're looking for," Sandel said.

Special election to decide fate of option tax

High School, Broadway Middle School, Seaside Heights Elementary School and Gearhart Elementary School for students from Seaside, Gearhart Cannon Beach. This is the fourth time voters have the option to renew the levy, according to Superintendent Doug Dougherty.

If the measure is approved, the levy will be renewed at the same rate for the next five years, starting with school year 2016-17. Residents will not see an increase because of the local option tax.

According to the state's Department of Revenue, most taxing districts are allowed to ask their patrons for temporary taxing authority above the permanent rate limitation. This authority is known as a "local option tax." Local option taxes are limited to five years for operations and up to 10 years for capital construction purposes.

Each year the tax would provide funds for the district, from \$1.22 million in 2016-17 up to \$1.4 million in 2020-21. Overall, more than \$6.5 million would be raised through the local option tax. This estimate is based on current data available from the Clatsop County assessor. Seaside's total school budget for 2015-16 was just over \$21 million. The additional revenue has to be used for operational costs, or to maintain current programs, services and staffing levels at the schools — items that directly impact students' classroom experience. It helps offset the costs of extra-curricular activities and sports, which are "very attractive to prospective teachers" and help the district bring in and retain quality teachers, Dougherty said. If the measure does not

pass, the district will need to make reductions in programs and increase class sizes.

Co-chair Lori Lum of the Vote For Kids committee, said she believes the measure "is vital to the school district." The committee, established about four months ago, raises awareness for the measure through presentations, handing out information and setting up signs. Lum has four children in

the school district and has seen the positive benefits of the additional revenue, but she said she would still be in favor, even if she didn't. "Good education leads

to good community," Lum said. "I'm all for a greater, stronger community and educating our kids."

The local option levy is not related to building new school facilities at a different location. A bond measure to do so was proposed in 2013 and failed. Dougherty has said the district likely will present a new bond measure some time in the next year and a half. Renewing the local option tax is the first concern, however.

"We've been trying to keep that separate," Dougherty said.
