Authors contemplate life in the quake zone

Acclaimed novelist and former senior meteorologist at the Weather Channel Buzz Bernard will join author Bonnie Henderson in a conversation about earthquakes, tsunamis and the Cascadia Fault. The discussion will be held in the Loft at Beach Books (616 Broadway) on Monday, Sept. 12, at 7 p.m.

Bernard is author of the novel "Cascadia," which imagines an earthquake and tsunami in a

fictionalized Manzanita. Henderson's book "The Next Tsunami: Life on a Restless Coast" discusses what we know about plate tectonics and earthquakes in the Cascadia subduction zone. Both have done extensive research and we can learn much from both — the historic and the imagined.
