Two arrested after car theft, chase

One suspect still at large

Two Seaside residents are in custody and one is still at large after allegedly stealing a car in front of a Seaside home sometime Saturday night, Jan. 29, or early the next morning.

Autumn Brelin, 20, and Cyrus Grabenhorst, 22, were arrested in Beaverton after allegedly trying to use a stolen credit card at a gas station in North Plains just after 8 a.m. Sunday, the Washington County Sheriff's Office said. Deputies are still looking for Jacob Terrill, 30.

Sometime between 6 and 7 a.m. Sunday, vacationers in a

home on North Prom reported that their car had gone missing, Seaside Police spokesman Jon Rahl said.

After Seaside Police informed local deputies of the suspects' whereabouts, the stolen car — a 2015 white Subaru Outback — was seen traveling east on U.S. Highway 26.

Deputies and Beaverton Police attempted to stop the car at Southwest Cedar Hills Boulevard and Southwest Park Way. When the three people inside did not stop, deputies and police briefly pursued the vehicle south on Cedar Hills.

After the car ran a red light a few blocks away, they decided to end the pursuit in or-

der to not endanger the public, deputies said.

A few minutes later, 911 calls indicated that the sus-

pects had parked the vehicle a couple of miles away and ran in different directions.

Police and deputies then surrounded the area and searched for the suspects with a dog unit. Two of the suspects were arrested within an hour, deputies said.

Police recovered a photo of Terrill from a stolen camera inside the car. All of the stolen belongings are believed to have been returned to the vacationers in Seaside, Rahl said.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office has asked that anyone with information about the burglary and theft or any of the suspects call 503-629-0111.

Four arrested on meth charges

Four people were arrested Friday, Jan. 27, at an RV park in Seaside on a variety of charges related to possession of methamphetamine.

The Clatsop County Sheriff's Office, along with other agencies, executed search warrants inside Seaside RV Park on South Roosevelt Drive. They found 9 grams of meth-

amphetamine, scales and packaging material.

Raoul Childs, 57, Luanne Cleveland, 47, Linda Needham, 57, and Edward Kemper, 58, were all arrested. Charges include unlawful manufacturing and delivery of a methamphetamine within 1,000 feet of a school, possession of methamphetamine and frequenting a place where controlled substances are used.
