## Meth, heroin found

Six people were arrested in Seaside early Tuesday, April 18, on drug trafficking

charges.

Authorities found methamphetamine, heroin, prescription pills, digital scales, packaging materials and a handgun at a residence in the 222 Third Ave. apartment complex.

Howard Lefstein, 41; Cla-

rissa Moore, 28; Sean Navarre, 42; Holly Sanders, 30; Alisha Lowenberg, 29; and Travis Carow, 39, were all arrested. Daniel Greenfield, 28; Courtney Butzer, 28; and Andrew Paulson, 36, were cited and released for frequenting a place where controlled sub-

stances are used.

The Clatsop County Sheriff's Office had been leading the drug trafficking investigation and made the arrests with help from the Seaside Police Department. Additional charges may follow as the investigation continues.

# Seaside man arrested after chase

On Wednesday, April 19, at 8:15 p.m. a disturbance was reported at a residence in the 1300 block of Second Avenue. The subjects were located leaving the area in a vehicle and stopped by responding Seaside Police officers.

After brief contact and attempts by officers to have the involved occupants get out of the vehicle to talk about the disturbance investigation, Christopher Rogich, 24, fled the area in the vehicle with a female passenger.

A pursuit ensued and eventually ended along the Young's Bay Bridge near Astoria. Rogich was taken into custody on multiple charges including

cluding a police officer, recklessly endangering another person, reckless driving, interfering with a police officer, resisting arrest and kidnapping II. The kidnapping charge was added after the female passenger of the vehicle later indicated the driver would not stop for police during the pursuit after being asked to do so.

Rogich was identified as the boyfriend of the female passenger. The female passenger was not arrested and later released with her infant child, who had been found to be in the vehicle with the parents after the pursuit ended. The case has been forwarded to the Clatsop County District Attorney's Office.
