Recology rates to see increase in Gearhart

Gearhart heard a presentation from Recology rate analyst Dave Larmouth, as he presented a proposal for a 2.70% rate hike, effective July 1. The rate is tied to the annual change in the consumer price index, he told councilors Wednesday, June

With the construction of a permanence hazardous waste collection program, the city will see an increase from \$3.50 per ton on inbound trash to \$5 per ton at the transfer station, in order to help cover the costs of the building and operating

A 32 gallon curbside cart service would see a monthly rate of \$20.52 to \$21.07.

Ninety-gallon pickup, currently \$34.25, would rise to \$35.17.

Gearhart will see a 2.70% increase in collection rates.

Sideyard pickup of a 90-gallon gart would increase from \$52.48 to \$53.90. Rates on 2- to 8-yard containers, debris boxes and rental containers would likely increase at the 2.70 rate.

A raise in recycling rates could be ahead, he added, if it gets harder to recycle those products.

The new recycling facility, anticipated in August, drew praise from Councilor Dan Jesse. "I'm in full support of the increase for hazardous materials," he said. "I've been bringing this up every year for years and I think it's great to get this going back on again."




