Tom Grant and vocalist Shelly Rudolph appear at the Astoria Golf and Country Club on Saturday, June 15. Their set highlights an evening of music and fine dining, with an evening opening performance by North Coast jazz standouts R.J. Marx and John Orr.

Grant, master instrumentalist, talented singer and natural entertainer nimbly walks the line between jazz tradition and modern pop. This soft-spoken Oregon native's inspired songwriting produces propulsive R&B grooves, infectious melodic hooks, and stylish ballads with equal ease. He plays jazz piano with the harmonic sophistication and deep sense of swing that only comes from more than four decades on the bandstand.

Rudolph has been singing, performing and composing for more than 20 years. Her projects have embraced soul, jazz, blues, R&B, reggae and pop. She is currently among the busiest vocalists in Portland, performing regularly every week with her own projects as well as with


