Fatality on U.S. Highway 26

On Friday, Aug. 30, at 12:10 p.m. Oregon State Police and emergency personnel responded to the report of a vehicle crash on Highway 26 near milepost 41.

Preliminary investigation revealed a maroon Toyota Yaris, operated by Ken Duong, 48, of Beaverton, was eastbound when for unknown reasons the vehicle left the roadway and struck the tunnel.

Duong sustained fatal

injuries and was pronounced dead at the scene.

Highway 26 was closed for approximately three hours.

Oregon State Police was assisted by ODOT, Washington County Sheriff’s Office, and Gaston Fire Department.

The next meeting of the Advisory Committee to the Oregon Department of Veterans’ Affairs to be held on Wednesday, Sept. 11, at the Holiday Inn Express in Seaside.

The advisory committee’s meetings are normally held at different locations across the state on the first Wednesday in March, June, and December, as well as the second Wednesday in September. The public is invited to attend and participate. The committee is made

up of veteran appointed by the governor to provide counsel on veteran issues and represent veteran concerns across Oregon. Its nine members serve in a vital advisory role to the director and staff of the Oregon Department of Veterans’ Affairs.

Health advisory at Short Sand Beach

The Oregon Health Authority issued a public health advisory Wednesday for higher-than-normal levels of bacteria in ocean waters at Short Sand Beach at Oswald West State Park in Tillamook County.

People should avoid direct contact with the water in this area until the advisory is lifted. Higher-than-normal levels of fecal bacteria can cause diarrhea, stomach cramps,

skin rashes, upper respiratory infections and other illnesses. This applies especially to children and the elderly, who may be more vulnerable to illness from waterborne bacteria.

While this advisory is in effect at Short Sand Beach, visitors should avoid wading in nearby creeks, pools of water on the beach, or in discolored water, and stay clear of water runoff flowing into the ocean. Even if there is no advisory in effect, officials recommend avoiding swimming in the

ocean within 48 hours after a rainstorm.

Although state officials advise against water contact, they continue to encourage other recreational activities on this beach because they pose no health risk even during an advisory.
