Girl dies after being pulled out to sea in Cannon Beach

A Portland 11-year-old girl died after she was swept out to sea last Thursday afternoon by a tide north of Haystack Rock in Cannon Beach.

Officials say the girl was located by a U.S. Coast Guard aircrew and brought back to shore by a jet ski and rescue swimmer. She was flown to a hospital. She was identified by her family as Lily Pearl Markwell, 11, of Portland.

In an obituary, the family said Markwell died on Friday at Providence St. Vincent Medical Center in Portland after being pulled from the water on Thursday.

"Lily was a spirited, beautiful girl since before she was born," the obituary said. "When she wasn't reading a book (fantasy was always a favorite) she was out finding adventure - rock climbing, swimming, biking, or just playing with her siblings. Lily was a joy to be around. She was usually very straight-faced, skeptical and a little sarcastic but always kind, especially to those who were vulnerable or overlooked."

A GoFundMe page has been set up to help the family with medical and funeral expenses.

Ninth county resident dies of coronavirus

A ninth Clatsop County resident has died from the coronavirus.

The Oregon Health Authority described the person as an 89-year-old woman who tested positive on April 11 and died at home on June 1. No other information was immediately available.

The health authority has recorded 1,060 virus cases in the county. Twenty-five were hospitalized and nine have died.

There has been a spike of more than two dozen virus cases reported over the past week.

He said none of the cases tied to workplaces have reached the state's threshold for disclosure, which is five for workplaces with 30 or more employees.

Parking change on **Ocean Vista in Seaside**

Speeding vehicles and limited visibility prompted the Seaside City Council to enact a parking restriction on Ocean Vista Way.

"When you are coming around, you're coming down Ocean Vista, and you're going to make a left on to Beach Drive, you cannot see around because of the cars there," City Councilor Tita Montero said.

The Transportation Advisory Commission reviewed the parking issue at the intersection of Ocean Vista Way and Beach Drive and came to the conclusion that parking on the west side of Ocean Vista should be eliminated, Public Works Director Dale McDowell said at Monday's City Council meeting. "Vehicles are parking on the grassy shoulder next to the Tides chain-link fence, narrowing the traffic lanes to a mere 13 feet wide."

In the last year-and-a-half, people have started parking on the grass "when there's really no need to," McDowell said. "There's normal parking on that side of the street, up to the ADA ramp and that's as far as we want it to go. So we would sign everything beyond that point."

The advisory commission recommended designating the area as "no parking this side of street" from the existing asphalt Americans with Disabilities Act-accessible ramp to the end of the fence.

The change will affect three spaces, McDowell said.

Mayor Jay Barber and city councilors Randy Frank, Tom Horning, Tita Montero, David Posalski and Steve Wright unanimously approved the parking change. Dana Phillips was absent.
