

# School: Most parents want in-person class

education, recess and other activities.

Fully vaccinated staff will be required to wear masks indoors only when students are in school. School districts may still choose to require face

coverings universally at all times.

The district surveyed families after school resumed on-site instruction to see if they wanted to stay in a virtual program or a full-time in-person classroom.

"They want it to be in

the building," Penrod said. "Very, very few parents shared that they would want to stay in the same online option, not enough for us to be able to offer something from our teachers."

While distance learning won't be directly available from the district, the North-

west Regional Education Service District will offer virtual classes to students who cannot come back on-site for medical reasons.

Registration begins Aug. 4 for students. Athletics practice, with a normal season planned, begins Aug. 16. Classes begin Sept. 7.

"To have our students back five days a week and have some semblance of normality is what we've been yearning for," Principal Jeff Roberts said.

After a season of stops and starts, Penrod made it clear that protocols remain fluid.

"These are conversations that the leadership team is still having, and we haven't made any definite decisions," she said. "We know that over the summer, things are going to change. But we want to let you know that this is the plan."

# Wahl steps down from Seaside school board

A.J. Wahl has stepped down from her position on the Seaside School District board.

Wahl, of Gearhart, filed in February to run for the Zone 3 Position 1 board

seat. Running unopposed, she garnered 1,714 votes, the most of any of the three candidates running.

But Wahl won't serve. As an attorney and mediator, she was named judge pro tem for the Clatsop County Circuit Court.

In her resignation letter to the board, she said rules

of Oregon judicial conduct prevent her from serving in public office.

Wahl is an attorney and mediator for Wahl LLC. She will still be eligible to continue to serve on the school district's budget committee.

The board unanimously voted to accept Wahl's

resignation.

Vacancies are filled through board appointment, Superintendent Susan Penrod said. The board appointee must be a legally registered voter and a resident within the district for one year immediately preceding the appointment, and a resident of the zone from

which the vacancy has occurred.

The zone represents Gearhart, but if an eligible resident cannot be found the board could appoint an eligible resident from the district overall. The appointed person will hold office for two years. The seat will be up for election in 2023.

# Construction: Projects expected to be complete by end of August

The project, approved by voters in 2016, moved Seaside's schools from areas within the tsunami inundation zone to a safer location in the southeast hills.

Inside Pacific Ridge Elementary School, interior wood trim and final furniture delivery remain

to be completed.

Outdoor work at the elementary school includes American With Disabilities Act-accessible ramps and a four-way intersection for "a little better enhanced transportation maneuvering at that intersection," Hardebeck said.

At the track, drainage around the perimeter of

the field is complete and field maintenance work continues.

Water being retained on the east end of the track "needs to go somewhere else," Hardebeck said.

That project was slated to begin on Monday.

At the middle school and high school, exterior remediation to replace

22,000 linear square feet of weather barrier after the first application failed to meet specifications.

"We've kind of finished up with all the remediation, thank goodness, and we're now we're into the site remediation, which is basically, landscaping, planting and irrigation," Hardebeck said.

"All those systems are up and functioning as they are designed to do."

At the west side entrance of the high school and middle school building, crews are stripping two additional ADA parking spaces and implementing exterior safety modifications.

Architects are still finalizing the design comple-

tion for adding some gym door vestibules to eliminate the water intrusion issues on those entries.

Hoffman Construction Co. will be complete with the summer work project tasks by the end of August, completing their contracted scopes of work and will demobilize from the campus, Hardebeck said.

is not what most people mean," Baker said. "People will live there, God willing, for three to four months until we can find them something more permanent."

The two-story facility will have three single bedrooms and one double bedroom.

Common areas will include a group meeting and social room, dining area and kitchen. An Americans with Disabilities Act-accessible bathroom and bedroom will be located on the first floor.

The three units underneath the building will eventually be permanent supported housing.

The shelter will be staffed 24 hours a day, she said.

People will have intensive support services to help them maintain employment and actively engage in sober support if they are in recovery.

The initial cost of renovation was \$400,000, but has increased with the cost of materials and the price of lumber, Baker said. "We now expect to pay close to \$500,000 to renovate the

three apartments, the green house and the clinic," she said.

Baker said she hopes additional funding from the state Legislature will allow the agency to hire at least two more staff, embedding one person in the Seaside Police Department and one in the Astoria Police Department, where the bulk of crisis calls come in.

"We have one mental health counselor who's on at any given time and a manager during business hours," Baker said. "With a county the size of Clatsop, it's

really hard to be available to respond to all the different calls that we have."

Agency funding increases, including potential federal and state dollars, could add staffing and provide quicker and more flexible responses.

"I, for one, call this a step forward for Seaside," Mayor Jay Barber said. "It will really benefit the people that you're serving. Keep us posted as things go along. Our neighbors will be interested to know how it develops, and how we can help you and support you."
