His illustrious career took Rick, Penny and their growing family all over the U.S. and, upon retirement, he settled in coastal Oregon, where he enjoyed his new life on the West Coast. Rick enjoyed crabbing in his Boston whaler, golf, poker

and nights with his buddies and a good bratwurst from his favorite Portland area market.

Rick was an accomplished fly fisherman, hunter, golfer and maker of his famed steak sandwiches. He passed his love of these hobbies to his three children, Rick, Scott and Tiffany.
