Fresh out of college, Vicki worked at a private Jewish grade school in Portland, and Lipman Wolfe's in downtown Portland.

Once she met her husband, they relocated to

Roseburg and then Eugene.

In 1974, along with her cherished 6-year-old son, Gerald Mattila Jr. (Jay), she moved to Northern California to live closer to her brothers.

Notwithstanding being a single mother, Vicki landed a full-time job working for county of San Mateo for 30 years as a welfare fraud investigator. The job required becoming weapons-qualified and carrying a badge.

She also served as homeowners association board president of Sand Harbor South in Foster City,



California.

When she retired in 2004, Vicki and her son, Jay, moved to the Oregon Coast. They found a great home to buy for her retirement years.

The last few years Vicki had health issues, and found

She is survived by her brothers, Kelley Davis and Scott Davis. Her brother, Bill Davis, and son, Jay Mattila, preceded her passing.

Vicki was a great mother, daughter, sister, and always a friend.

Ecola State Park remains closed

Ecola State Park is closed until further notice as a result of damage to the park's sole entrance road.

Recent heavy rains caused a sinkhole in the road and reactivated a longstanding landslide that triggered a fissure in the road. Oregon Parks and Recreation Department staff will evaluate the best way to repair the damage. It could take several weeks or longer to reopen the park, according to Park Manager Ben Cox.

Visitors may still access the park via the Tillamook Head Trail.
