The department currently has six full-time employees — chief, two division chiefs and three firefighters — and about 30 volunteers, he said.

Gordon Houston, a fulltime Portland firefighter, continues to volunteer in Seaside and serve as volunteer deputy chief, he helps coordinate all the recruitment, including the resident volunteer program, currently with four interns participating.

"We've been pretty successful over the years, with volunteers and our resident program," Houston said. "Since I've been here for 20 years, we've had close to 50 people get jobs full time, some of them here."

The interns live in rooms above the station. "This program has been crucial for not only the students but to assist with staffing calls," Daniels said.

Even with the extra help the levy could bring, volunteers remain essential, volunteer association president Jason Schermerhorn said. "That's really the backbone of the fire department," he said. "We do a lot of work and I'm learning something new every day while helping people. It really is a great

want to start a small child care business. House Bill 4011 creates qualified mental health associate incentive program within Oregon Health Authority.


"We really want to address the business side of child care," Armitage said. "And really empowering more folks to start these businesses be successful and pencils out."


