Though these events will be sorely missed, other activities and embellishments have been added to round out a busy weekend for both spectator and participant.

Starting off Friday night there will be the Teen Dance with Steve Gustovich's Ultimate Sound. The three day softball tournament will also get under way. It is not known at present when the senior King and Queen will be crowned, but Senior Center President Gerry Russell states that this year nominations for this honor may be made by members of the community at large. Nominations may be brought to the Center, he said. They will be chosen by ballot at the Senior Center at noon on July 10.

Saturday's major features are the parade and the horse show. The parade with Dot Yadon and Bill Hawkins, the Citizen of the Year award winners, as co-grand marshals, promises to be the best parade ever, with numerous and varied entries, including a guest horse drill team and the Astoria Clowns, who will stay the day to amuse and titillate the crowd with their antics.

The Ridge Riders and their guests will present their program in the afternoon and will also have a gaming show on Sunday afternoon. Across the river, on the Sword Ranch, the Forest Hills Black Powder Brigade will again have their shooting competition and primitive camp, Saturday and Sunday.

Bright and early Sunday morning the thundering hoofs and the report of a black powder pistol fired by circuit riding preacher John Cahill, will call people to worship in Anderson Park. This will be followed by a more sedate service in the open area between the Evangelical and Baptist Churches.

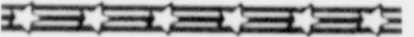
The major event of the Jamboree is still the logging show on Sunday afternoon, directed this year by Randy Hansen of Mist.

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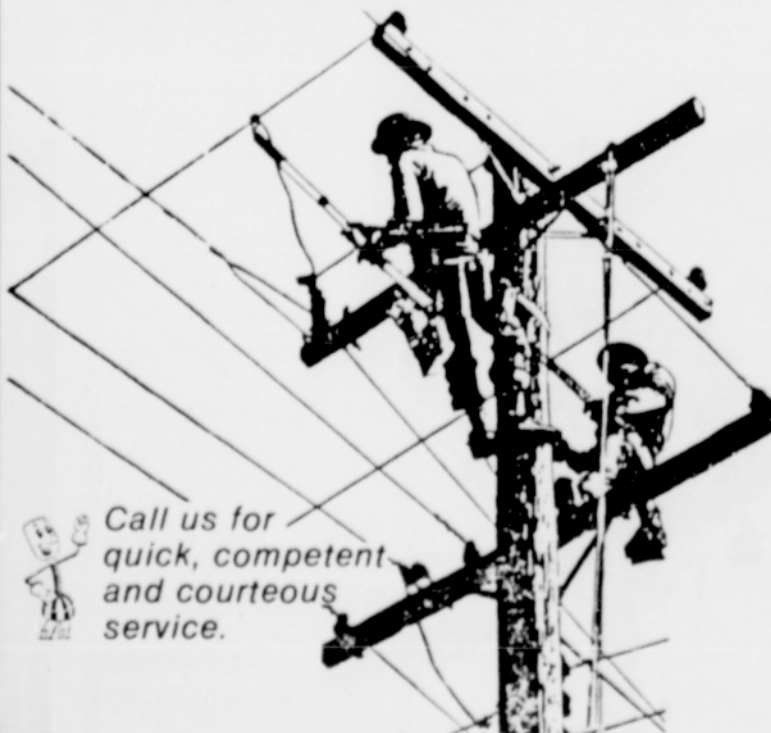
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
