

Track team has fun while working hard in practice and competition

In the first track meet of the season, at Warrenton, the Logger girls team placed third, barely losing second place by half a point to Warrenton.

the children before June 9.

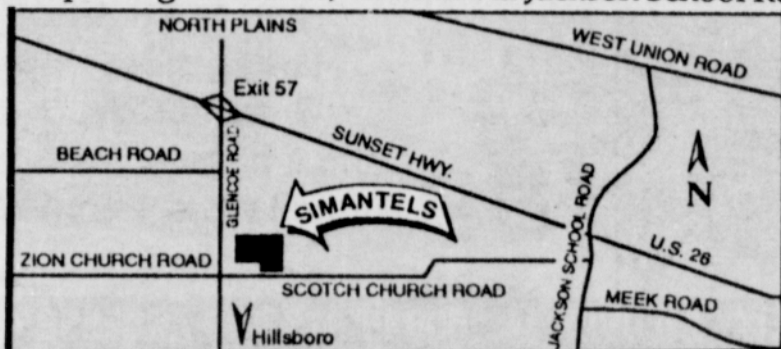

The showmanship contest for 4-H will consist of four school-class divisions. In the FFA showmanship contest, a novice and an advanced class will be provided.

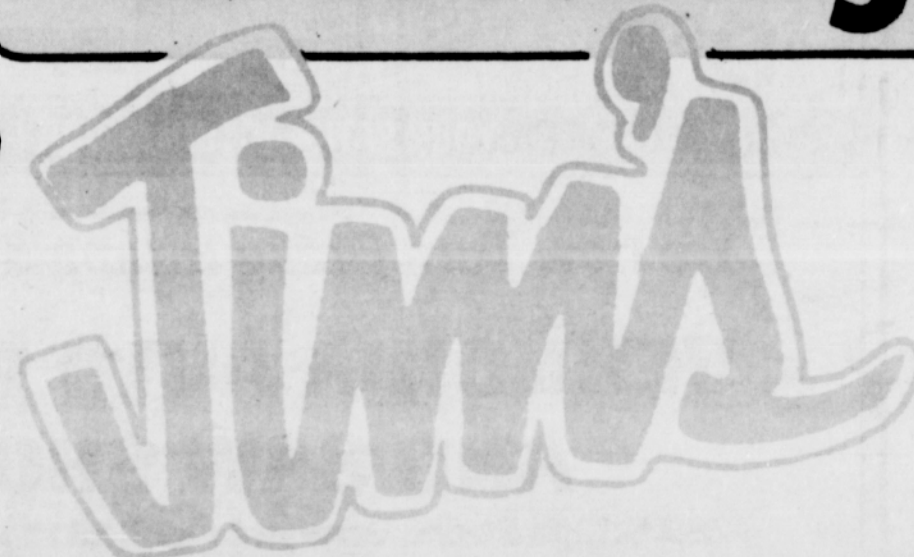
Competition is open to all 4-H and FFA members. Trophies and awards will be pre-

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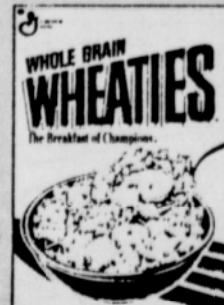
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
