

Two deputies seek election to Columbia County Sheriff position

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ballot in the November General Election.

Two experienced law enforcement officers are seeking the job of Columbia County Sheriff: George R. Hulit

and John M. Cage are both deputies in the department now.

On the Democratic Party ballot, Columbia County Commissioner Dale Heilmuller, of St. Helens, is facing

five challengers: Don Cass, of Columbia City, is a retired dry-wall and painting contractor.

Cher Fillman, a Rainier City Councilor, operates her own accounting and tax consulting business.

Jack Peterson, of St. Helens, is a real estate salesman and former county commissioner.

Dan Sprague, a Clatskanie School Board member, is a retired farmer and sawmill operator.

Frank Thompson, also from Clatskanie, serves on the board of the Columbia Education Services District and is a retired logger and farmer.

Joel Yarbor, a St. Helens resident and quality control tester, is the only Republican candidate for Commissioner.

Neither County Clerk Elizabeth (Betty) Huser, nor Assessor Tom Linhares, face a challenge on either ballot. They are both Democrats.

In Washington County, six contenders are seeking the chairperson's seat on the nonpartisan Board of Commissioners:

Bob Cios of Tigard, Bill Kipp and Linda Peters, both of Beaverton, Steve Stolze of Tualatin, Mary L. Tobias of Sherwood, and Roy C. Webster of Banks.

Four candidates are on the ballot for County Commissioner Zone 4, which includes

Banks, Buxton, Manning and Timber. They are Andy Duyck of Forest Grove, Forest Grove Mayor Richard G. Kidd, Karen McKinney of Hillsboro, and Richard Stolte of North Plains.

County Auditor Alan Percell is unopposed.

Clatsop County's ballot features a race for District Attorney. Joshua K. Marquis, who was appointed to fill the remainder of former D.A. Julie Leonhardt's term, is facing Paul Flannery, a deputy district attorney for Clackamas County. This is a nonpartisan race.

In Oregon Representative Dist. 2 (Part of Columbia County, most of Clatsop and Tillamook Counties), Jean McMahon is trying to unseat

incumbent Tim Josi on the Democratic ballot.

Scott R. Bushnell is unopposed for the Republican nomination.

Oregon Rep. Dist. 1 (Most of Columbia County and part of Clatsop County) incumbent, Tony Federici, a Democrat, has no opposition on either ballot.

In Oregon Rep. Dist. 3 (western Washington County), Republican incumbent Charles Starr is unopposed.

Democrat Marcus Simantel, also running unopposed, will face Starr in November.

Oregon Senate Dist. 1 (Columbia, Clatsop and Tillamook Counties) incumbent, Democrat Joan Dukes, has no challengers on either ballot.

A single statewide ballot measure

The only state-wide issue on the ballot, Measure 2, would allow new fees to be placed on wholesale imported motor vehicle fuel to subsidize the costs of underground

tank replacement. It would not apply to fuel taxes now being collected.

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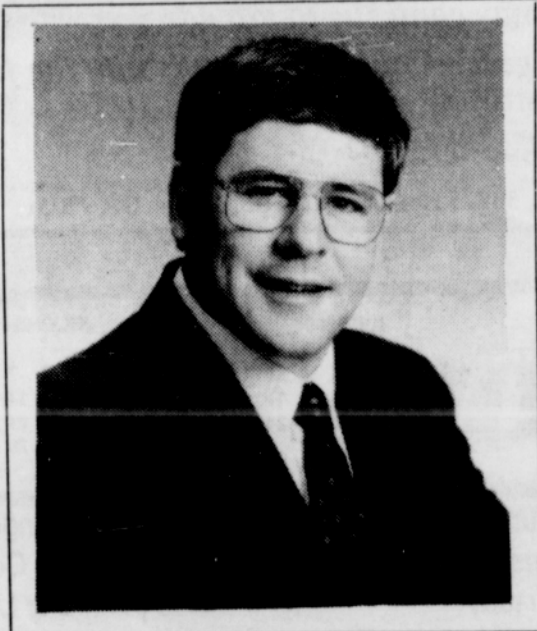
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State Representative Dist. #2
