George E. King, 71, Baker City, died July 7, 1994, at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Baker City. Services were held July 12, at the Baker City Church of the Nazarene, with Pastor Jerry McConnell officiating. Graveside services will be held Thursday July 14, at 11:00 a.m. in Vernonia Memorial Cemetery in Vernonia.

Mr. King was born April 9, 1923, in Corvallis, to Henry and Blanche King. At the age of two, he and his family moved to Vernonia, where he was raised and educated. After high school he attended Oregon State University in Corvallis.

In 1946 he married Tharis Robertson in Vernonia where they made their home. He then began a career in electric utility cooperatives. After moving to Corvallis he worked for Consumers Power for fifteen years. Mr. King later became manager for Clearwater Power in Lewiston, Idaho. After his retirement, he took a job in 1989 as manager with the Oregon Trail Electric Co-op in Baker City.

Mr. King was a past master of the Corvallis Masonic Lodge, a member of the Scottish Rite and the Shrine. He served as president of the Clarkston Golf Club and was past president of the Lewiston, Idaho, Chamber of Commerce.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN the Columbia County Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing on a request from David & Melissa Hunt for a Conditional Use Permit to site a nonresource related single family dwelling on Highway 47, Vernonia, OR. This 6.47-acre property is zoned Primary Forest-76, and is identified on the Assessor's Records as Tax Account Number 4431-000-00102. If approved, the Conditional Use Permit will allow the applicant to site a nonresource related single family dwelling on the property.

Said Public Hearings will be held before the Columbia County Planning Commission on Wednesday, July 20, 1994, in Room 315, Circuit Courtroom, on the Third Floor of the Columbia County Courthouse Annex, St. Helens, OR, starting at 6:30 p.m., at which time proponents and opponents of the request will be heard.

The criteria to be used in deciding the request will be found in some or all of the following documents and laws, as re-

vised from time to time: Oregon Revised Statutes Chapters 92, 197 and 215; and Oregon Administrative Rules chapter 660; and Oregon Statewide Planning Goals; and Columbia County Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision and Partitioning Ordinance, and Planning Commission Ordinance. The specific criteria applicable to this request are listed and evaluated in the staff report.

A copy of the application, all documents and evidence relied upon by the applicant, and the staff report are available for inspection at no cost and will be provided at reasonable cost at least 7 days prior to the Commission hearing from Land Development Services, County Courthouse Annex, St. Helens, OR, 97051.

If additional documents or evidence are provided in support of the application, any party shall be entitled to a continuance of the hearing. Unless there is a continuance, if a participant so requests before the conclusion of the initial evidentiary hearing, the record shall remain open for at least seven-days after the hearing.
