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Make It Yourself with Wool contest slated for Oct. 29

Even though it's still summer, it's not too early to start sewing for the annual "Make

It Yourself with Wool Contest," held every fall throughout Oregon. The 1994 District

7 contest is scheduled for Saturday, October 29, at the Latimer Quilt and Textile Center. District 7 includes Clatsop, Columbia and Tillamook counties. This contest is open to youth and adults.

All those entering the competition must select, construct and model the garment themselves. Machine or hand-knitted, woven, crocheted garments are acceptable. All entries must be made from a minimum of 60% wool fabrics or yarns. To be eligible, a garment must have been completed after January 1, 1994.

The "Make It Yourself with Wool" contest is sponsored by the American Sheep Industry Association. The purpose is to focus attention on the beauty and versatility of wool; encourage the use of this fabric or yarn in sewing, knitting or crocheting fashionable garments and offer the opportunity to compete for prizes and recognition.

Entry categories include adult (over age 24), senior (17-24), junior (13 to 16) and pre-teen (12 and under). The junior, senior and adult winners in the district contest will advance to the state contest, December 3, in Hood River. State winners in the junior and senior divisions will advance to National competition.

Pre-entry is required by October 14, two weeks prior to the district competition on Saturday, October 29. Entry forms and complete rules are available at the OSU Extension office in each county, many fabric stores and from Home Economics teachers in the public schools.
