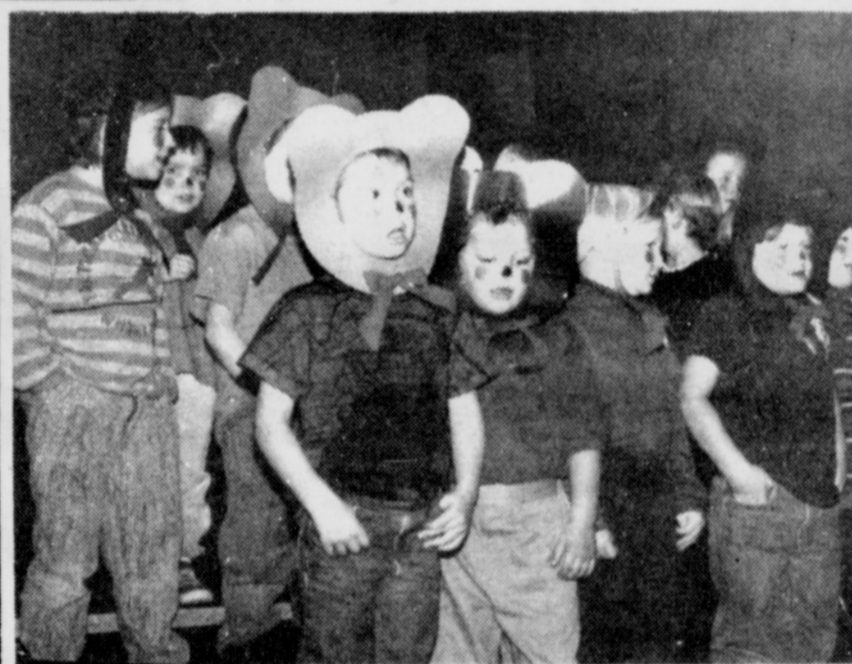


Holiday activities keep children and adults busy until Christmas









WE WISH YOU A SAFE CHRISTMAS

Don't let that glow in the sky this holiday season be your house. Play it safe by practicing these precautions. Remember fire only needs a chance — so don't give it one.

	Keep your tree in water at all times and away from a fireplace, heater or radiator.
	Check your tree lights for frayed or exposed wires, loose connections or broken sockets.

	Switch off tree lights before going to bed or leaving the house.
	Do not leave small children unsupervised around a Christmas tree or electrical-powered decoration.
	Take a check for overloaded circuits. Don't put more than three sets of lights on one extension cord.
	Have a fire extinguisher in your home at all times, and install a smoke sensitive fire alarm.
