

Jamboree King & Queen will be chosen at coronation on Friday

The Vernonia Friendship Jamboree Court has been reinstituted after an absence of nine years.

On Friday, August 4, a queen and king will be crowned to kick off the 1995 festivities.

Princesses Fawn Daniels, Kory Nelson, Katie Parrow and Jamie Stacklie will be joined by princes Erik Davis and Tom Enneberg for the weekend events. All members of the court are either attending, or graduated this year from Vernonia High School.

The six member court was selected from a field of twenty on the basis of information supplied in a written application that included a brief autobiography, a statement of educational goals and why they felt they should represent school district 47J.

The judges will interview

each candidate and evaluate their merits and their stage presentation as well.

The two named as king and queen will each receive a \$500 scholarship to further their educational goals.

Fawn Daniels, 18, is the daughter of Doug Daniels and Beverly Marks. She has a brother, Trask, 17, and three sisters, 14 year old Lily, 3 year-old Hannah and 2 year-old Haley.

Fawn has been active in cross country and plans to enroll at Cascade Christian College this fall. She hopes to become a social worker.

Kory Nelson, 18, is the daughter of Jan and Cindy Nelson of Mist. She has one brother, Kyle, 20, and a nine year-old sister, Kendell.

Kory plans to attend Lower Columbia College in Longview to study Early Childhood Education to become a pre-school or kindergarten teacher.

Katie Parrow is the 18 year-old daughter of Randy and Sharon Parrow. She has two sisters, Wendy and Julie. She also has a brother, Bryce.

Katie plans to enroll at Portland Community College this fall in a program leading toward becoming a Physician's Assistant with a special emphasis on pediatrics.

Sixteen year-old Jamie Stacklie will be a senior at VHS this fall. Her parents are Robert and Pat Stacklie. She has two sisters, Julie, 27 and Jessica, 15.

Author Robin Cody is Grand Marshal for '95 parade

Oregon author Robin Cody will serve as Grand Marshall for this year's Jamboree Parade.

Cody, who was born in St. Helens in 1943 and grew up in Estacada, is the acclaimed author of *Ricochet River*, a novel published by Alfred A. Knopf in 1992, and *Voyage of a Summer Sun*. The latter is a non-fiction account of Cody's 82-day solo canoe trip down the Columbia

River, from its source in Canada to its mouth at Astoria. It was published in March of this year.

A graduate of Yale, Cody taught English and coached baseball for ten years at the American School of Paris. Returning to the U.S. he was dean of admissions for a few years

at Reed College in Portland. In 1984, he left Reed and started writing full-time.

He lives in southeast Portland with his wife, Donna. Their 25-year-old daughter, Heidi drew the illustrations for *Voyage of a Summer Sun*.

Special parade viewing areas set

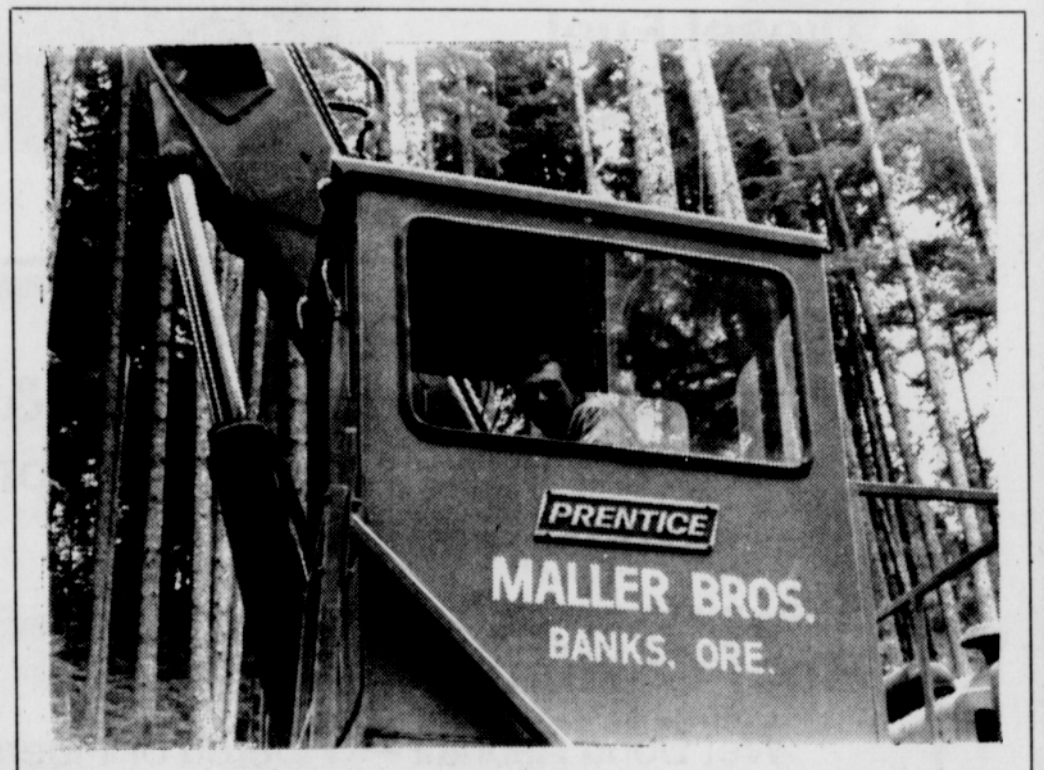
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
