Dr. William Albert Turska, 85, Mist, died Aug. 25, 1995, at his home. A Celebration of Life service was held Sept. 1, at the Haakinson-Groulx Mortuary Chapel in Clatskanie with the Rev. Jan Adams of the Clatskanie Presbyterian Church officiating.

Dr. Turska was born in Aberdeen, Wash., on April 24, 1910, the son of Finnish immigrants, Jack and Linda (Sovinnon) Turska, and graduated from Wetherwax High School in Aberdeen in 1929. That year he began study at the Philadelphia College of Naturopathy, continuing in 1930 at

the Seattle College of Chiropractic and Naturopathy.

He also attended Emerson University at Los Angeles, Southwest College of Natural Healing of Arts and Sciences at Dallas, Tex., and took a semester at Harvard University.

Before World War II he had an office in Clatskanie. From 1941 to 1945 he served with the U.S. Coast Guard.

After completing his studies in 1953 he started his own hospital near Green Mountain at Astoria, where he practiced for 12 years before moving to Phoenix, Ariz., and later to Shoshone, Idaho. He returned to Clatskanie in 1973 and practiced there until moving to Mist in 1979.

In 1979, he married Ardys A. Wilson.

Dr. Turska was acclaimed for his research in ozone therapy, hernia repair, chelation, and the Turska formula in herbal medicine. He was Professor Emeritus of the National College of Naturopathic Medicine in Portland, which he helped found, and was listed in the *World's Who's Who* as a researcher.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Phyllis Guile of Hoquiam, Wash.; three grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; a cousin, Ann Paavola of Clatskanie; a niece and a nephew. He was preceded in death by a sister, Alfid Lehto.

Oral testimony in favor of or in opposition to the request will be received during the hearing. Written testimony must be submitted to the City Recorder no later than October 12, 1995, by 11:30 a.m.

Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter, or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision-maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the State Land Use Board of Appeals on that issue. The approval criteria for the proposal are provided under Art. 8, Sec. 8.030 of the City Zoning Ordinance regarding consistency with comprehensive plan goals, objectives and policies; compatibility with surrounding uses; capability of public facilities in supporting the proposal; and compliance with statewide planning goals. The request is further required to show proof that the change conforms with the comprehensive plan; there is a public need for the change; the public need will be best served by making the change, as compared to other available property; proof of change in the neighborhood or error in the original plan; and potential impact upon the area.

The application and pertinent documents will be available for inspection at no cost (copies provided at reasonable cost) at Banks City Hall, 100 S. Main Street, Banks, OR, during certain morning hours. Contact Bob Prickett at 324-5112 for time when City Hall is open. A staff report will be available for inspection at no cost on or about October 5, 1995 (copy provided at reasonable cost) at City Hall.
