

Vernonia Police Report

Weapons seizure at Timber home

Sixty weapons and a small amount of marijuana were seized by Washington County Sheriff's deputies last Saturday from the home of a Timber man.

The weapons were found during a warrant search of the home of Joel Richard Williams, 46, 27530 NW Timber Road, who faces accusations of menacing, reckless endangerment and vandalism from incidents that occurred on Oct. 27 and Oct. 28.

According to the Washington County Sheriff's office, the seized firearms included 33 rifles, semi-automatic as-

sault rifles, shotguns and 27 handguns.

Williams was initially arrested after allegedly threatening a Banks homeowner, firing weapons into the air and at a paint can in the homeowners yard.

During the search, deputies also found four ounces of marijuana, which resulted in additional charges against Williams, of manufacturing, possession and distribution of a controlled substance.

Williams posted bail of \$4,000 and was released from Washington County Jail late Saturday.

Kauppi tract closed by vandalism

Though they had intended to leave the Kauppi tract open for hunting season, Cavenham Forest Industries has been forced to close the gates because of vandals who drove four-wheel drive vehicles in and "cut cookies" into the newly planted acre-

age. "This particular tract cost \$350 per acre to prepare and plant," explained Cavenham Forest Manager Bill Marré, "because it had been a meadow. We regret having to close it, but we really have no choice."

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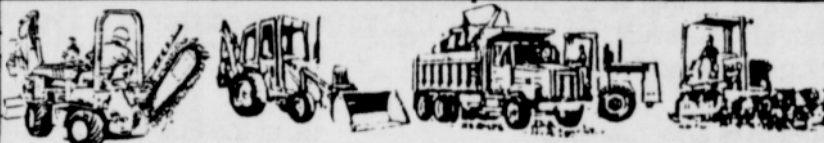
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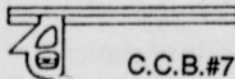


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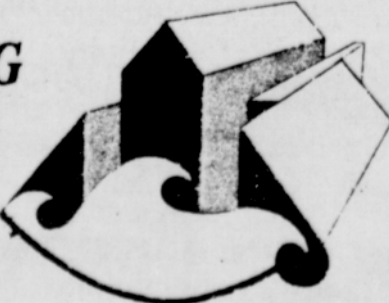


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
