

## Talk on atoms, integrated circuits

Dr. Mary Fehrs, professor of physics at Pacific University, will speak on the creation of the atom bomb and the integrated circuit, at the fourth lecture in the 1995-96 President's Lecture Series, on Wednesday, March 6.

The Byte and the Bomb begins at 7:30 p.m. in Marsh Hall's Taylor Auditorium on campus. The lecture is free and the public is invited. A reception will follow in the lobby of Marsh Hall.

Dr. Fehrs' discussion will focus on the development of the atomic bomb and the integrated circuit, both revolutionary devices (in radically different ways) that were developed around the same time.

In both instances, research universities, industry and government all played important roles in the development of the technologies that made them possible, but the processes were quite different in America, Germany, and Japan, she says.

How these technological developments varied in different societies can tell us much about modern science and modern society, according to Fehrs.

Dr. Fehrs received her Ph.D. in physics from Boston College in 1972. Fehrs, who has taught in the Natural Sciences Division at Pacific

since 1979, co-directs the annual Summer Science Camp for Girls at Pacific University, which is funded by the U.S. Department of Energy.

The President's Lecture Series at Pacific University is now in its 13th year. The series was established in 1983 as a means of sharing the scholarship and teaching of Pacific's faculty with the campus and with the people of the surrounding communities.

The final lecture in the 1995-96 lecture series is scheduled for Wednesday, April 17: Witchcraft: Historical Tradition and Modern Interpretation by Martha Rampton of the History Department.

All lectures are free and the public is welcome.

## Emergency food stamps

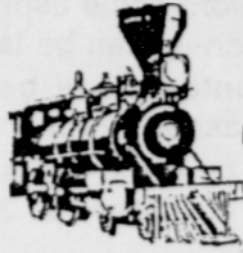
A special federal program that provides disaster-related food stamps and disaster-related unemployment insurance benefits is now available in Vernonia.

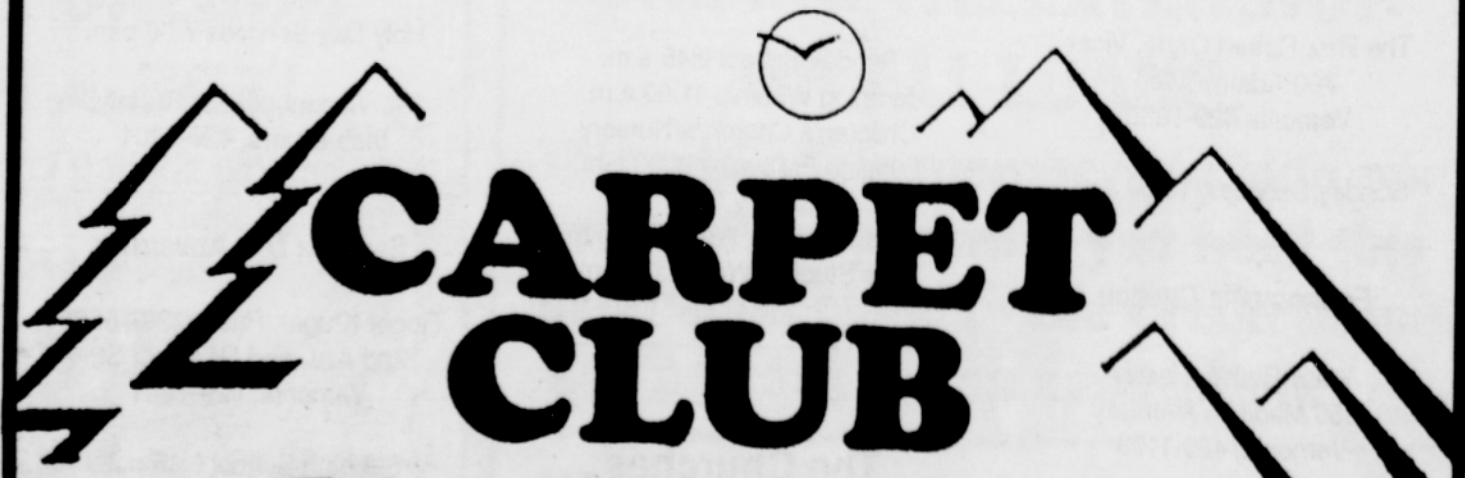
