New VHS principal has strong business experience

Vernonia High School's new principal, Oregon native Nancy Elliott, entered the field of education in a non-traditional way.

After graduating from the University of Oregon with a Bachelor's degree in Marketing/Industrial Management, she started out in business, then married and raised a family.

When Elliott returned to the business world, she found herself increasingly involved with education, an involvement she extended by returning to school for a Master of Science degree in business education. Then, when she decided to earn an administrative credential, it was a logical extension of her life.

In addition to teaching a broad spectrum of business courses, Elliott has developed curriculum, taught overseas, developed guidelines for citizen review processes, analyzed and designed reorganization systems for school offices and records management, and much more.

Of special interest to the local area, is her extensive experience in the School-to-Work program, where she authored a handbook, created job opportunities for students,

established partnerships with business, placed high school students in career-based experiences and presented career awareness programs to elementary school students.

"Learning is a life-long process," Elliott said. "It doesn't stop at a certain time in a person's life."

It's obvious that she heeds her own words, too. Part of her personal education includes foreign language skills in Spanish, German, French and Finnish.

Elliott has also been greatly involved in unpaid community service, in organizations as varied as the League of Women Voters, Stop Oregon Litter and Vandalism (SOLV), and Future Business Leaders of America.

"I'm very enthusiastic," Elliott said of her position in Vernonia, "and I look forward to a positive school year."

Presently commuting from southwest Portland, Elliott and her husband are familiar with the Vernonia area and will look for a home here when things are a little less hectic.

Elliott's husband, Dave, is retired but working as a consultant. They have two adult sons.
