Pacific University schedules an interesting blend for 1997-98 Performing Arts Series

Featuring a mix of fiery instrumentals, airy ballads, powerful a cappella voices and light-hearted comedy, Pacific University's 1997-98 Performing Arts Series will bring a wide variety of musical genres to Forest Grove beginning in September.

This year's line-up includes world renowned artists Riders in the Sky, Jon Nakamatsu, Solas, Street Sounds, and Eric Tingstad and Nancy Rumbel.

The series opens Saturday, September 20, as the

three cowboys of Riders in the Sky turn out silvery tunes with comical style. Then Jon Nakamatsu, gold medal winner of the tenth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition takes the stage on Thursday, October 16.

Next, Solas comes to town on Friday, November 7, bringing traditional Celtic music with a contemporary, urban flair. Then it's African chants mixed with rhythm and blues as Street Sounds delivers on Saturday, February 28, 1998.

Rounding out the series on

Sunday, April 4, 1998, will be Eric Tingstad and Nancy Rumbel, a duo with a reputation for serene instrumental sounds and acoustic excellence.

Special events this year include an old-fashioned holiday celebration by Portland's own Trail Band on Saturday, December 6, and a performance by the Oregon Symphony, under the direction of Resident Conductor Murry Sidlin, on Thursday, February 12, 1998. In addition, Pacific University and the Forest

Grove Chamber of Commerce will team up this year to present the annual "Stars in the Grove" community concert showcase on Saturday, February 21, 1998.

The Performing Arts Series, now in its fifth consecutive season, is sponsored in part by Tuality Healthcare. All shows are held in McCready Hall, Pacific's intimate 400-seat concert hall located inside the Taylor-Meade Performing Arts Center.

A season subscription to Pacific's Performing Arts Se-

ries is available at a 15-percent discounted price of \$70. Buyers receive a 10-percent discount off the total price if they choose three or more shows. Tickets for individual performances range from \$16 to \$18. Special event tickets range from \$4 to \$16. Columbia Theatre's first Stagecompany season will start with David Mamet's Oleanna

A hilarious comedy will offset three riveting dramas in The Stagecompany's first season, with the opening of *Oleanna* in the Pepper Studio Theatre at Columbia Theatre for the Performing Arts (CTPA) in Longview.

Oleanna appears at 7:30 p.m. Thursday through Saturday Sept. 11-13 and Sept. 18-20. David Mamet's 1992 drama is about a routine encounter between a professor and one of his students that evolves into a nightmarish

stand-off in which such issues as academic freedom and sexual harassment become deadly weapons.

In *Oleanna*, a male college instructor and his female student sit down to discuss her grades and in a terrifyingly short time become participants in a modern reprise of the Inquisition.

Innocuous remarks suddenly turn damning. Socratic dialogue gives way to heated assault. And the relationship between a somewhat boring teacher and his seemingly

hapless pupil turns into a fiendishly accurate x-ray of the mechanisms of power, censorship and abuse.

James Murphy directs Peter Alzado as the professor and Deirdre Murphy as the student in this stunning modern play. Mamet is the author of acclaimed plays *Speed-the-Plow*, *Glengarry Glen Ross* and screenplays for films including *Homicide* and *The Verdict*.

Also scheduled for the Stagecompany's 1997-98 season are Andre Roussin's

hilarious comedy, *The Little Hut*, in November; Henrik Ibsen's world classic *A Doll's House*, in January, 1998; and *John Brown's Body*, a sweeping saga of the Civil War by Stephen Vincent Benet, in May, 1998.
